Add-Drop Period

Important Note: **The add-drop period runs for the first week of courses only!**

Be sure to ask for course approvals early to allow time for processing!

All courses you wish to add need to be approved by 4:00pm on Friday, January 11. Students must meet prerequisites and seats must be available in the desired classes.
